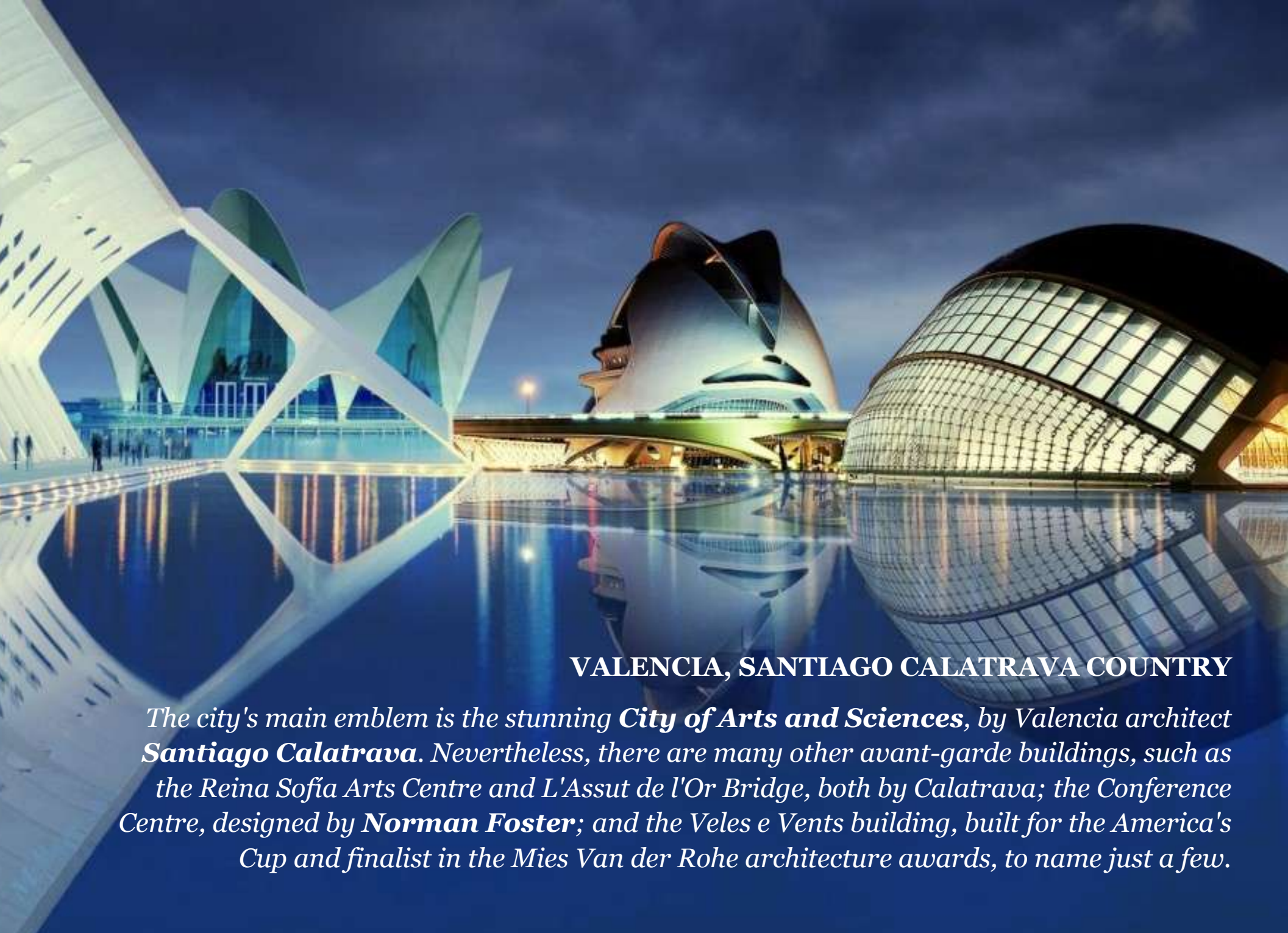


BARCELONA, A REAL OPEN-AIR MUSEUM

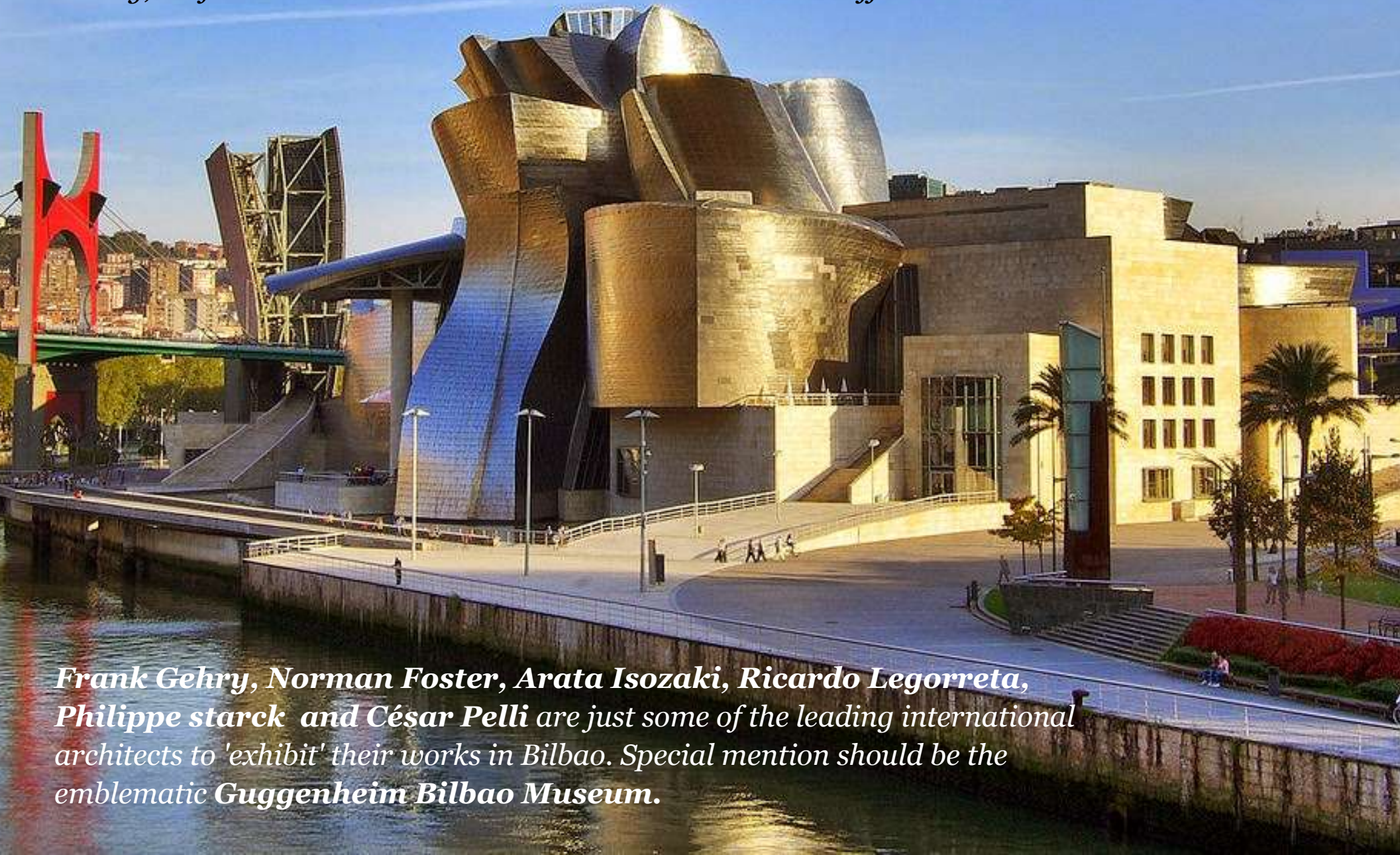


VALENCIA, SANTIAGO CALATRAVA COUNTRY

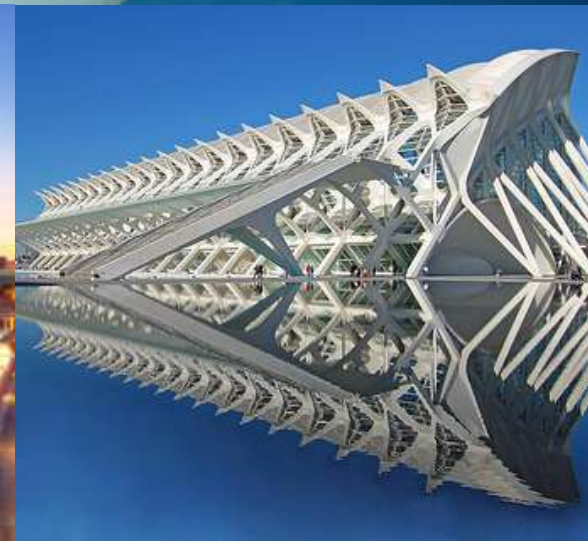
1st day Arrival in Valencia

We arrive in Valencia and meet our fellow passengers. We check in to the hotel and join our group for dinner and a tour briefing. There are international overnight flights to Valencia (VLC) or you can travel to Madrid (MAD) and high speed train to Valencia.

2nd day Valencia, Santiago Calatrava Country

There are few cities like **Valencia**, able to harmoniously combine the remnants of its farthest past, dating to the year 138 BC, with the most innovative and **avant-garde** buildings from the new millennium.

The City of Arts and Science is a big complex made up of 8 different buildings (L'Hemisfèric, El Meseu de les Ciències Príncep Felipe, L'Umbracle, L'Oceanogràfic, El Palau de les Arts Reina Sofia, El pont de l'Assut de l'Or, L'Agora and Torres de Valencia), the outstanding work of two Spanish architects of international prestige: **Santiago Calatrava** and **Félix Candela**. We will discover and enjoy it through an **architect, who will explain us** from the beginning of the project to the final of construction, from the viewpoint of architecture.



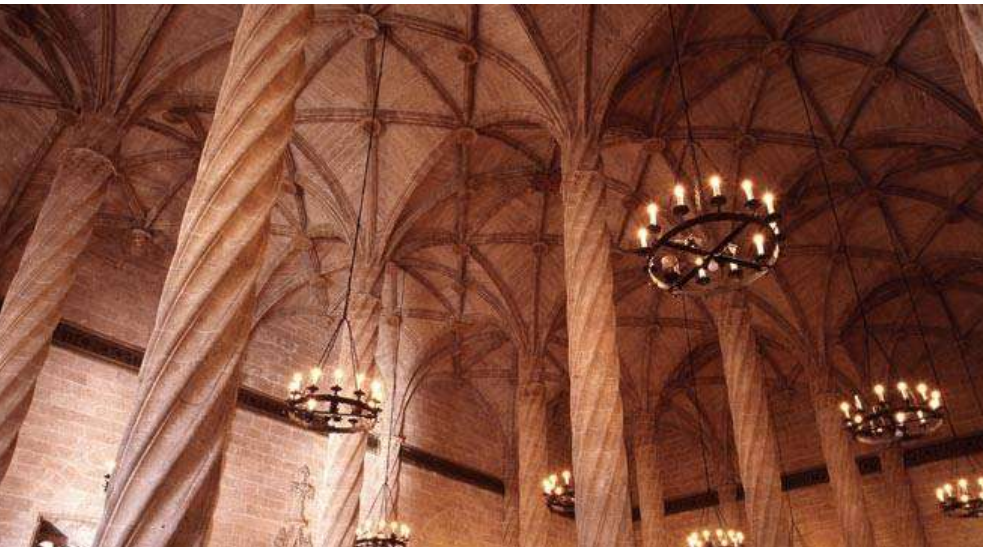
ITINERARY

2nd day Valencia, Santiago Calatrava Country

Lunchtime! Did you know? Valencia is home of **Paella** dish originated in the 18th century.



We will have time to enjoy a great paella in **The Veles e Vents** innovative building, won on the **LEAF Award**, a prestigious European architectural prize, from the prestigious architect **David Chipperfield**. A tasty rice, overlooking the Mediterranean sea, the sun and good vibes are the best attraction.



After lunch, why not spend the afternoon getting to know Valencia's historic quarter in the daylight? **Silk Exchange** (the jewel of European Gothic civil architecture. Built in the 15th century) which boasts **UNESCO World Heritage** status, the Palace of the Valencia Regional Government and the Cathedral.

In the evening departure from Valencia to Barcelona private transportation in the comfort of an executive minibuss.

3rd, 4th and 5th day Barcelona and Gaudí's buildings Heritage

Barcelona, is a Mediterranean and cosmopolitan city with Roman remains, medieval quarters and the most beautiful examples of 20th century Modernism and avant-garde architecture. The city's origins are Roman, and its long history and economic dynamism have made Barcelona a cultural city, which can be seen in the historic-artistic heritage and the promotion of the most innovative artistic trends. Popular culture also has its manifestations in this city, which still conserves its most cherished traditions

Strolling around the streets of Barcelona will bring surprises at every turn. Pedestrian streets in the old quarter, green spaces, and a splendid **seafront** lovely urban beaches with a range of modern facilities are a reflection of its multi-faceted character.

Besides the famous and eternally-modern work of **Antoni Gaudí**, another architects such as **Domènech i Montaner** or **Puig i Cadafalch** fill the streets of Barcelona with fantasy (**art nouveau architecture**) have been declared **World Heritage Sites** by **UNESCO**.

3rd, 4th and 5th day Barcelona and Gaudí's buildings Heritage

Soaring, vertical, stylised... it defies the heights. This is how the **Sagrada Familia** rises up towards the sky. It is Barcelona's most visited building and the finest work of modernist architect **Antoni Gaudí**.

The Sagrada Familia **UNESCO World Heritage Site**, is a grandiose work, architecturally complex and full of religious symbolism.

The great genius dedicated more than 40 years to the church, and, after his death in 1926, the project continued according to his original plans and drawings and is still unfinished - work is scheduled to end in 2026, the hundredth anniversary of his death. This earned him the nickname "**God's Architect**".

It will be the tallest church building in the world as well as the church with the tallest spire in the world.



ITINERARY

3rd, 4th and 5th day Barcelona and Gaudi's buildings Heritage

Park Güell: The architect's passion for natural shapes. Park Güell is like something out of a fairy tale. It's a strange place, peculiar, even dreamlike, but it's certainly beautiful. A walk through this park awakens even the least active imagination. The weird shapes and daring colour combinations, mingling with the plants, create a different world that visitors find irresistibly attractive.

When Gaudí gained his architecture degree, Elies Rogent, head of the Barcelona School of Architecture, said: *"Whether we have given a degree to a madman or a genius only time will tell."* Undoubtedly, time has opted for the second choice and Güell Park, declared a **World Heritage Site by UNESCO** in 1984, is proof of this!



3rd, 4th and 5th day Barcelona and Gaudí's buildings Heritage

Casa Milà “La Pedrera” house a masterpiece by **Gaudí**. An ironic allusion to the resemblance of its façade to an open quarry. For its uniqueness, artistic and heritage value was inscribed on **World Heritage Site by UNESCO**. Everything in this building is curved and undulating. Architecturally it is considered an innovative work by having a structure of columns and floors free of load bearing walls. Similarly, the front – which is made of stone – is also self-supporting, i.e., not loads of floors.

Salvador Dalí about Gaudí: *“His houses are for erotomaniacs, where you can dream as well as live”*



ITINERARY

3rd, 4th and 5th day Barcelona and Gaudí's buildings Heritage

The Casa Batlló: The House of Bones or carnaval, one of the jewels of **Art Nouveau**. It remains one of Gaudí's most important works, due to its symbolism, as well as his contribution to geometry and new design and building techniques which tie in with some of the characteristics of surrealism, cubism, expressionism and constructivism. **UNESCO World Heritage Site!**

Let's take a walk starting in Fundació Antoni Tàpies with an experienced architect to the **Eixample master plan**, designed by engineer and visionary **Ildefons Cerdà** visiting some examples to understand it.

Along with Barcelona's new business and technology district 22@ in the former industrial area of Poblenou it probably has been the neighbourhood with the liveliest planning and building activity in recent years.

6th day Zaragoza “Water and Sustainable Development” buildings

The Expo 2008 was an international exposition held in 2008 in Zaragoza, with the theme of “Water and Sustainable Development”.

Aragon Pavilion: Architects Olano y Mendo

Conference Centre: the building was designed by the renowned firm of architects Nieto and Sobejano.

The Water Tower: its vertical icon. Designed by Enrique de Teresa, it is 76 metres high with 10,400 accessible square metres.

Zaragoza Bridge Pavilion: is a building designed by British-Iraqi architect Zaha Hadid.

Visit to **Pablo Gargallo Museum**, famous spanish sculptor and **Aljafería Palace**, a Moorish palace belongs to the Mudéjar architecture which has been declared **UNESCO World Heritage**.



7th and 8th day La Rioja, visionary architecture. Vintage wine experiences.

Along with medieval wineries, you will also find avant-garde art in the form of installations designed by the most famous architects. An array of sensations awaits to you!. A brilliant, bright colour, fruity flavour and pleasant palate are just a few of the features of **Rioja Alavesa red wines** from the grape varieties of Tempranillo. We won't forget to delight your palate in the most artistic wineries, **you'll love both its wines, gastronomy as its modern architecture!**

Bodegas Marques de Riscal, by Frank O.Gehry

Marques de Riscal winery is the oldest and most traditional of the Rioja. The architecture of Gehry follows a sculptural style and a personal vision of architecture, creating functional sculptures. The building is a rectilinear composition of prisms that float above the ground thanks to three supercolumnas that support the entire building. Lunch time!

Bodegas Baigorri by Iñaki Aspiazu

A building, that is fully adapted to the existing topography, developing all the process harmoniously underneath its surface. It is a place where the visitor can gaze at the production process of the wine. Bodegas BAIGORRI was designed and built by the architect Iñaki Aspiazu, who tailored the building to the unique way our wines are made and it is considered as a reference of modern architecture in the area which blends with its surroundings. Lunch time!



Bodegas Ysios by Santiago Calatrava

In an idyllic enclave at the foot of the Sierra de Cantabria, Ysios opens its doors to invite you to discover an signature winery that surprises and fascinates. It is the only winery in the world designed by Santiago Calatrava, fully integrated into the landscape, which the author describes as an ongoing dialogue between the construction and nature, which certainly overwhelms and leaves no one indifferent among the thousands of people who visit us every year.

Ysios Winery, designed to develop expressive and delicious reserve wines, it is a must that will leave a lasting memory forever!

9th day

Bilbao, outstanding architectural site

Guggenheim museum, a titanium building. It is a museum of modern and contemporary art, a spectacular structure made of titanium, glass, and limestone – designed by architect **Frank Gehry**, he has won, among others, the Pritzker Architecture Prize, but will go down in history for projecting what is considered to be the best building in the world in the second half of the 20th century, namely the Guggenheim Museum Bilbao.

A singular tour taking you not only through the exhibitions, but also giving you an exclusive glimpse behind the scenes at the Museum!

The Guggenheim Museum Bilbao kicked off the ground-swell of creativity and Bilbao has successfully used that to create an innovative and contemporary architectural jigsaw, both in terms of the shapes and the use of materials.

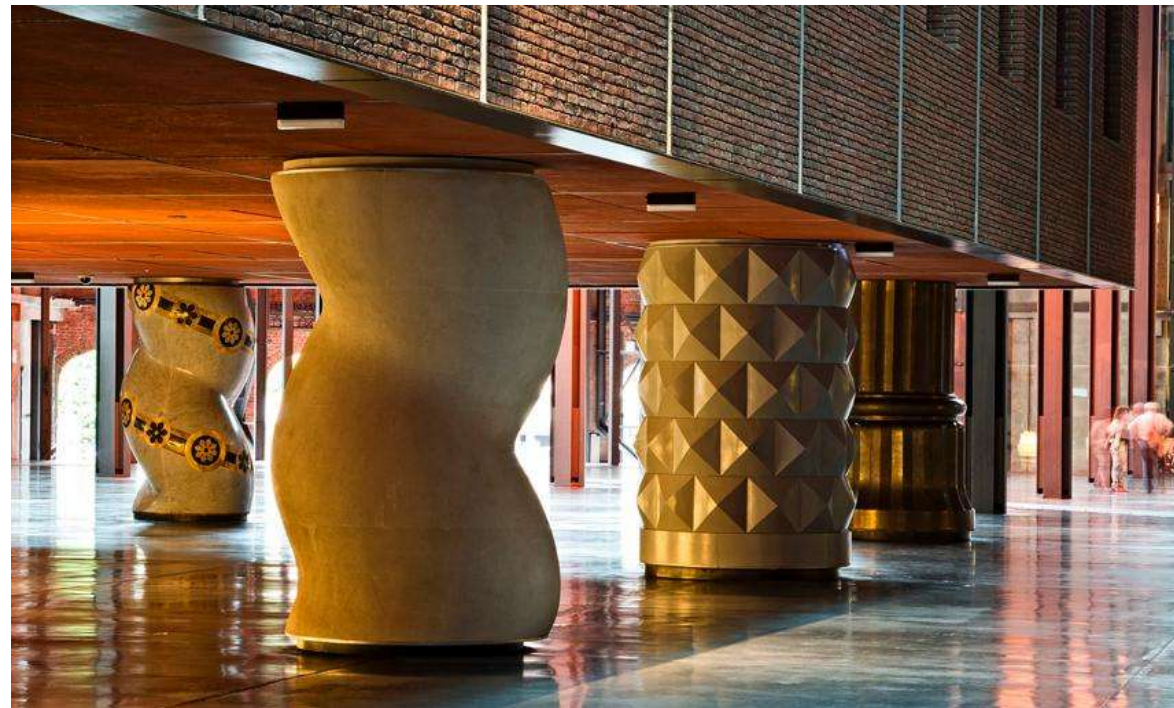

Cancellation Policy

Payment in full is required when registration is completed less than 60 days before the departure date. Space is subject to cancellation by the Tour Operators if payments are not received when due. If a participant would like to cancel they must send an email notification.

Please note your cancellation is not considered official until you have received a return email confirmation acknowledging your cancellation. At the time we receive your cancellation notification, the following per person charges will be applied.

91 days or more before departure: €300 cancellation fee, plus any additional costs incurred, as well as any fees that are charged by the suppliers providing the services included in the Trip. If your spot is filled by another participant, we'll refund your deposit minus payment processing fees and €100 administrative fee.

61-90 days before departure: €500 cancellation fee, plus any additional costs incurred, as well as fees, if applicable, that are charged by the suppliers providing the services included in the Trip. If your spot is filled by another participant, we will refund your deposit minus payment processing fees and €100 administrative fee.

60 days or less before departure or anytime after departure: NO REFUNDS WILL BE GIVEN and your deposit will be forfeited. Payments in Full are required no later than 60 Days prior to departure.
